Mary Oliver, a beloved poet and spiritual writer, passed away this January. Her poetry has inspired writers, thinkers, artists, and many others throughout the decades. In humility, we give thanks for her work and God's call on her life to give us these beautiful words to meditate on as we journey in our own faith.

I believe one of the most resounding parts of her poetry was that she was humble – she offered real, vulnerable, and honest reflections of what it looks like to walk through this life. The poem that I have offered here, 'The Summer Day', is a favorite of mine.

I like that she says, 'I don't know exactly what prayer is.' Is that not true for many of us? What is prayer, what should it look like, and how does it feel to communicate with the divine? How do we pray authentically, in our own way, to the 'one who made the world?'

The second favorite line that she writes is the bold question she leaves us with, 'Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?' The doors are wide open, God's grace is abundant, and this life is not a dress rehearsal. This is our life, gifted from God – so I leave you this month with this same bold question: What do you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?

Our Annual Congregational Meeting is on Sunday, **February 10**immediately following the worship service for the purpose of receiving the 2019 budget and annual committee reports. Committee Chairs and program leaders are busy compiling year-end reports for our look back and celebration of all that was accomplished in 2018. This is also a time to look ahead and share dreams and the budget for 2019. Traditionally, we have also approved Terms of Call for our pastor but procedures were changed this year so Terms could be approved in November and be in place ahead of the new fiscal and tax season. That meeting will again be held in November this year.

In April we meet to elect new officers. Each year three members are elected to serve two -year terms as elders. An elder may be asked to serve a second term but must step aside for at least a year at the end of the second term. We have a wonderfully dedicated group of active elders. If asked, I hope you will give prayerful consideration to the invitation.

Every week there is more progress in the Sanctuary on the new components for the installation of the sound and visual system, and we eagerly arrive to see what has been added. New hymnals, choir robes, paraments, a fifth octave of handbells, and new bell table skirts are also in use.

The results from the Holy Cow assessment program the congregation completed in November were shared with Session. Pastor Becca will summarize them for us - watch for details in the March edition of CrossRoads.

Be sure to plan to stay for our Souper Bowl bread and soup lunch on **February 3** before the Super Bowl. The Youth will take your monetary donations to go shopping and stock the Sykesville Middle School Food Pantry.

All special offerings, our Fair Share portion to Presbytery, donation to ESCAPE, and per capita responsibilities have been sent.

Our Next Concert: Wherligig (Celtic) February 10 @ 3:00 pm



While we are sad that our original group, Peat & Barley cannot perform for us as planned (due to health issues), we are pleased that Wherligig has agreed to come and take the February concert spot. They have performed for our concert series in the past, so we know we are in for an afternoon of good music!

Since 1985, Wherligig has delighted and educated audiences in the US mid-Atlantic with the earthy sounds of acoustic Celtic and Nordic traditional music. This family music ensemble combines repertoire from Ireland, Scotland, England, Wales, Sweden, and Wales in performances ranging from the concert stage to classrooms,

restaurants, festivals, weddings, and private gatherings.

The current lineup of this versatile ensemble features Ken, Ryan, and Stephanie Koons, and Niccolo Seligmann. Ken plays the six- and twelve-string guitar, tin whistles, bones, and hurdy gurdy. Ryan plays the fiddle, tin whistle, nyckelharpa, crwth, plucked and bowed psalteries, and sings. Stephanie is on the hammered dulcimer, neo-Celtic harp, and harmonium. Niccolo plays the viola da gamba and bodhran (Irish frame drum). Ken, a master instrument maker whose instruments are known for their beauty and tone, has built or restored most of the instruments the ensemble uses during performances. Wherligig's love of traditional music and culture and their joy in making music together as a family add a distinguishing quality to their performances.
