We have chosen to send our portion to Mission of Mercy, a mobile unit providing

health care, prescriptions, dental care and compassion to portions of Carroll and Frederick County. Last year we were able to send them \$105. Let's see if we can send more this year!

Grace and Peace to you, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

"But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." – Amos 5:24

On April 24th in a small fellowship hall at St. Paul's United Church of Christ in Westminster, I had the distinct privilege to hear vulnerable stories of injustice and pain at the Poor People's Campaign Gathering. People gathered from different religions, cultures, and ways of life – from the Unitarian Universalist Church in Finksburg, to a local Jewish community and beyond. Speakers shared varied stories – a woman who was a veteran who is part of a peace campaign, a man who shared his story about institutional racism, and a woman whose chasing of the 'American Dream' of money led her to recognizing the weight of poverty and burn-out in our society.

The campaign leaders shared a wealth of worrying statistics, but here I will share just a few:

40.6 million people live below the federal poverty line in the U.S and nearly ¾ are women and children.

13.8 million low-income households cannot afford water.

Approximately 22 veterans a day commit suicide.

The scope of the campaign is triumphant: to wage peace instead of war, to stop poverty, to end systemic and institutionalized racism, and to stand in solidarity with those in the minority. To sum up the campaign, perhaps you could say that the campaign seeks to make America a place where all are safe, equal, and well-nourished – mind, body, and soul.

Many will say their scope is too big, perhaps too grand – yet, isn't that what we are called to? A call that is grand, a call that takes the impossible and says, "With God, all things are possible." A call to recognize, just as in the book of Amos, that God desires a world where justice rolls as freely and bountifully as water and righteousness is ever-flowing, continued, in all times and places.

I share all of this information with you for what may seem to be a simple reason: as Christ followers, we are called to this work of justice. Whether that's with the Poor People's Campaign or another entity, I encourage you to hear the stories of the often misunderstood and unheard. Let those stories change you, transform you, and encourage you to do the good work of justice and righteousness, here and now. Amen.
