Grace and Peace to you, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

At the end of this month, we enter into one of my favourite weeks of the year: Community in Action Camp. This initiative is the brainchild of Connie Robinson and Charles and Deb Sperling – a new take on Vacation Bible School.

We live in a world and a church that is continually called to adapt and change based upon our context and the ways in which we best serve our community in Christ. You'll see signs everywhere this summer for Vacation Bible Schools, with hip programming and cool curriculums. While there is a place and time for Vacation Bible School, Springfield has come to realize that we need to offer something different. The Presbyterian Church is part of a tradition called 'the Reformed Tradition' and one of the common phrases you hear in this tradition, coined by Karl Barth is, 'reformata et semper reformanda' – which means 'reformed and always reforming.'

Currently, at Springfield, we serve Junior and High School students who would not benefit from a standard children-centered curriculum. Instead, we tailor a curriculum for these students, and for the community as a whole. C.I.A. Camp hopes to bring people together, all along the spectrum of ages, genders, sexual identities, and more. We ran our initial C.I.A. Camp last year and found that more people were willing to get involved, and so, following our pilot year, we are hoping that this 'new thing' that we are doing in community continues to take shape through the Holy Spirit.

If you were involved in last year's C.I.A. Camp, you'll see some of the same activities and some new as well. Please take a close look at what is going on throughout the week and see where you would like to participate – whether that's serving or experiencing – all are welcome. If you have questions about this new thing that Springfield is doing, I encourage you to come and ask, be curious, and see what the Spirit is up to at Springfield!

From Linda Caviglia - Minister of Music



Noisy Offering Update: Small Gifts, Big Impact.

Your small change made a BIG change!! Our first noisy offering was quite a success. The total amount collected was \$87. The Mission Committee made the decision to put this money toward items from the Presbyterian Giving Catalog. As the Catalog states, "Gifts to the Giving Catalog are signs of our gratitude: feeding the hungry, comforting the brokenhearted and sharing our faith with young and old. By joining our gifts together, however large or small, we expand our witness to God's gracious and abundant work in the world."

Here are the gifts we chose:

Piglet - \$40

"A piglet can serve as a valuable safety net - a source of income for a family in need. When sold at market, a pig can be the very thing that helps a family through times of struggle."

Family of Chickens – \$25

"Eggs for food, feathers for pillows and fertilizer for crops. By giving a family of chickens, you can help improve the food security and livelihoods of farmers and families around the world."

The \$22 that is left over will be added to money collected during our next Noisy Offering, which will be taken up on June 30.

Pentecost Offering

Pentecost Offering, one of four PC(USA) yearly offerings, is to be received on **June 2 and June 9**. The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people by inspiring them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world and to build a life of faith. For this offering congregations retain 40% for local programs focused on children at risk and development of youth and young adults; 25% Presbyterian Mission sends to programs supporting young adults in fellowship, worship and service throughout the world; 25% goes to guiding youth in their walk; 10% goes to child advocacy protecting and educating our children and youth in mind, body and spirit.

Springfield's Mission Team agreed to again send our portion earmarked "for at-risk children" to Mission of Mercy, a traveling medical van providing health care and free medications to those without health insurance are underinsured, or cannot afford their deductibles. They have now added a mobile dental van, enabling them to treat all health concerns in one visit. They have served Carroll County for 25 years, providing free medical care to almost 9,000 and free dental care to more than 3,000.
