Grace and Peace to you, in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

As the leaves fall to the ground and they crunch underfoot, we may be reminded of all the seasons we weather here in Maryland. This season though, has been a difficult one for many who have experienced natural disasters. While our Cuban Partnership was here in early September, the moderator of El Centro Presbytery in Cuba faced a phone call that her daughter's house was destroyed in Hurricane Irma. While Cuba felt a world away, seeing her face and hearing the destruction gathered us quickly together in prayer and all of a sudden, our worlds felt much closer, much more intertwined.

Many in our world will be looking up to God for different reasons – to thank God for saving them, to blame God for the destruction, to renounce God and lose faith because their faith was so challenged. As we read in the Psalms, God can handle all of it – our joy, our anger, our loss of faith, our confusion – and God still welcomes us in and hears our varied prayers. It's tempting in times like this to blame God and walk away, but the God of my own theology says that God weeps with us, rejoices with us, walks with us, and never abandons us. Will I ever understand why these terrible natural acts happen – no, it is a divine mystery I will not understand in this lifetime. Yet, in faith, I trust in a God who knows our pain and knows our human limitations of divine understanding.

The question remains – what can we do? What, in our world where we can feel powerless and helpless, can we do? We can be the hands and feet of Jesus. We can pray for those hurt, we can send aid items to affected areas, and we can donate money to those places that need it the most. I would advise you to check out Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (<a href="http://pda.pcusa.org/">http://pda.pcusa.org/</a>) to explore the many ways you can help with the gifts and talents that God has given you. May we all seek to be a voice of hope, love, and caring, in a world that needs it in plenty. Amen.

## Session News

#### From Sharon Pappas - Clerk of Session

In the September newsletter, I shared happenings from our last meeting held the end of August. The new month of September was full of all the program start-ups: choirs, band, Sunday school, fellowship time, Youth Group, Community in Action, Movie Night, Head Huggers (knitters and crocheters), Fairhaven communions.



There was also an all-day elders retreat at the Shrine of St. Anthony for a day of visioning. Being mindful of all those commitments, and because everything is running smoothly, we rescheduled our September Session meeting for October 12. Thank you to everyone who is so quickly stepping up where there is a need.

The Mission and Christian Education teams are planning another Christmas party for the Women and Children's Shelter in Westminster. Connie Robinson is coordinating that with Human Services and Wesley Freedom and will have more details on that soon.

The Peace and Global Witness offering, October 1, is used to train counselors in peace-building refugee camps, support programs aimed at ending human trafficking, and work with young people transitioning out of prison or homeless. This year our 25% portion is to be donated to Legal Services Corporation---America's Partners for Equal Justice. This non-profit established in 1974 provides aid in areas of family law, housing and foreclosure cases, consumer issues, employment and income maintenance, (obtaining promised wages or benefits), help for military families, and responds to disasters with Red Cross and FEMA.

If you've enjoyed our concert series, you might want to check out an event at Wesley Freedom, Friday **October 6**, at 7:00 pm. This is a fund raiser for the community Feed My Sheep program, housed in their building, offering a warm noon meal on Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays. They anticipate a variety of music styles from classical, pop, Broadway, movie themes and jazz, plus a variety of instruments including horns, piano, violin, etc. There will also be one musical number with costumes and dancing. We hope you can come!

#### <u>Presbytery Disaster Assistance</u>

At Springfield we always want to be aware of joys and concerns around us. There is need in so many places in our world that we feel we cannot be in all places. PCUSA's Disaster Relief Assistance program works globally, in refugee camps and through natural disasters. At any time money can be sent from our office to PDA.
