Springfield Cemetery – Memorial Day and More....

On Sunday, May 28th, Springfield Presbyterian Church members honored the memory of veterans resting in Springfield Cemetery by placing American flags at 112 gravesites. The cemetery is almost certainly home to more veterans whose status as such is not recorded in cemetery records: we also commemorate the sacrifice and willingness to serve of these unidentified individuals. We likewise remember those veterans from our own families who have gone on before us, wherever they may rest. Thank you to all who were able to take part in this solemn Memorial Day tribute.

The passing of Memorial Day seems an appropriate time to update the status of Springfield Cemetery's Veteran's Memorial Project, which actually began to take shape a couple of years ago under the hands of one of Springfield Presbyterian's former youth – Evan Stinson. A couple of SPC members inquired about the Memorial when they saw it during the placing of flags on May 28th. Under Evan's guidance, a group of Boy Scouts constructed a circular patio to eventually be encircled by an upper and a lower garden wall/knee wall (with openings on either side of the patio) and complemented by three flag poles and a garden area between the patio and the knee walls. This is not the reflection patio flanked by benches in the upper part of the Cemetery, but a separate patio lower in the Cemetery. As part of an Eagle Scout project led by another member of Evan's former troop, the knee walls were completed in 2016. A third scout is currently seeking approval to complete the final phase of the Memorial as his Eagle Project - installation of the flag poles and garden/landscaping – with final completion and dedication possibly by Memorial Day 2018, and no later than Memorial Day 2019. The flag poles would be used during interment services for veterans and on certain other occasions. As part of Eagle Scout requirements, the individual Boy Scouts who have led the various phases of the project raise all necessary funds for the project (related to proper site preparation, etc: Evan alone raised over \$1,100.00 in donations) and provide the needed labor. The paving stones and wall blocks used in the project were separately donated by their manufacturer, the E.P. Henry Co., under its "Heroscaping" program.

Although this is a Veteran's Memorial, one of the three marble plaques to be set into the knee walls (black marble with white lettering) will serve to remember <u>all</u> those who lie in unmarked graves in the cemetery. Apart from individuals listed in cemetery records whose graves were never marked, it is the Cemetery Board's understanding that there are some graves in one smaller area of the cemetery (that is designated not for sale) that were never recorded – possibly even to include graves of some slaves. The three plaques, which Tegeler Monument Co. graciously volunteered to donate and install when they first learned about the Memorial Project from members of the Cemetery Board, will read: "On Behalf Of A Grateful Nation..."; "In Honor Of All Who Have Valiantly Served"; and "This Garden In Memory Of Those Resting In Unmarked Graves". I would encourage everyone to take a ride through the Cemetery and see how nicely this Memorial is proceeding.

Springfield Cemetery Company

Although the current Springfield Cemetery Company (SCC) is an independent entity, the Cemetery was established by Springfield Presbyterian Church, and a connection between the Cemetery and the church continues to exist, as <u>required</u> by the SCC by-laws established at the time the Cemetery was "spun off." The by-laws stipulate that the SCC Board of Trustees consists of five members from the Springfield Church membership rolls and four members from the community who have some vested interest in the cemetery (e.g., have family members buried in the cemetery, own burial lots themselves, etc). The Board is currently in need of a church-member Trustee. If you think you might be interested and might have any questions, please speak with Bob Rogers or Ron Holmes. I don't want to presume to speak for Bob, but I do think he would agree with me when I say that serving in care of this humble and sacred resting place very often feels much more like a privilege than a chore.

Our Mission trip in 2017 will be in Baltimore through The Center, **July 30 through August 5**. Under their new guidelines, rising 7th graders and older may participate.
