

From department stores, to Christmas tree farms, to lights on houses and wreaths on doors, there is no doubt that we are in the season of Advent, marching forth towards Christmas. This Advent season, the carols are often sung merrily and joy warms the air even despite the depths of cold air and sweeping winds. Yet, what if you are not feeling cheerful? What if you do not want to join in the song, the carol, and yuletide banter?

You might just find that you are not alone. This season, for the first time at Spring-field, we are offering a 'Blue Christmas' service, which is on **December 21st**. You may be relieved to know that there are no such parameters – even the happiest person in the congregation is welcome to this service. Perhaps you are happy this season, but this service is still useful for you – as you can come on behalf of someone else in your life who is suffering and learn how best to support them and encourage them. All are welcome to this service.

What might this service look like? It is a time to gather together as community, to remember and light candles, to recognize that even in our sadness, we recognize Emmanuel – God with us. The best way to understand this service is to come and join, to bring a family member or a friend. If you have questions, concerns, or would like to see the liturgy of the service, I am happy to sit down with you and share it with you, so you can better grasp this 'new thing' that is happening at Springfield.

Whether this season finds you joyful, sad, glad, numb, or any of the other feelings that can be tied to such a season – know that you are welcome here at Springfield to find respite, peace, and renewal in this family of love.

At Thanksgiving, thoughts went to remembering friends, family and our many blessings. On All Saints Day we gave thanks and remembered loved ones no longer with us. Our vase of carnations was especially full this year. In our gratitude we also look to ways to help those around us who might need a meal or a friend. November 19 was our turn to serve the Feed My Sheep meal to such a community of neighbors. Wesley Freedom, St. Joseph, and several other local groups put together Thanksgiving boxes for families.

The Greening of the Sanctuary is completed, as well as the training for the new sound/av system. Pastor Becca, Jennifer Wise and Tony Caviglia worked to identify the functions we wanted and the configuration for our space. They are all eager to try those systems. We can smile from our pews and watch as the knowledge and use evolve. Also, in the Sanctuary you will see new paraments, choir robes, hymnals, and hear a new octave of bells.

At the meeting of the congregation on November 18 there was unanimous approval of the Terms of Call for Pastor Becca. Thank you to all who were able to be present to show your support for her ministry. This meeting is usually held in February but Presbytery and legal resources recommended we approve it now so all the proper figures are on tax documents before the end of the year.

Session will meet next on **December 13** with a primary focus on setting the budget for 2019. We will have figures from the Stewardship Campaign and a few recommendations for adjustments from committees.



In January 2001, after spending a year or so jamming in various local spots throughout Pennsylvania and Maryland, the original members of the group just sort of individually gravitated to the weekly Monday night Jam Sessions at the Dutch Country Restaurant in Hanover, PA. It didn't take long for the guys to realize what a great sound they produced together and they soon decided to form a band. The group "took off" from the very start, winning first place at the 2001 Fiddler's Convention in Westminster, MD.

The band numbers four members, all who are dedicated to preserving the old-time traditional bluegrass in the style of Bill Monroe, Dr. Ralph Stanley, and others. Most bands have only one lead singer, but with Iron Ridge everyone sings lead on different songs, so the band's "sound" offers a great variety. Check out their performance schedule and come hear for yourselves. You won't want to miss the awesome picking and fabulous three- and four-part harmonies of Iron Ridge!
